1. CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner Kubaszko called the regular meeting of December 14, 2020 of the Economic Development Commission of the Village of Bartlett to order on the above date at 7:02 p.m. and NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN pursuant to Section 7(e) of the Open Meetings Act as set forth in Senate Bill 2135 signed by Governor J.B. Pritzker on June 12, 2020, making it effective upon said signing ("SB 2135"), that the regular meeting of Economic Development Commission of the Village of Bartlett (the "EDC") scheduled to be held on December 14, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. at the Bartlett Municipal Building, 228 South Main Street, Bartlett, Illinois, may be conducted by audio or video conference without a physical quorum of the members of the Village Board present because an in-person meeting is not practical or prudent due to a disaster, that being COVID-19 pandemic and the applicable restrictions imposed under various laws rules, restrictions, Executive Orders and/or announcements issued by Illinois Governor J.B. Pritzker and/or Ngozi O. Ezike MD. Director of the Illinois Department of Public Health, including without limitation "Restore Illinois: A Public Health Approach to Safely Reopen Our State", which currently limits gatherings to the lesser of 25 people or 25% of the capacity of the meeting room as a public health measure.

5. INTRODUCTION OF NEW COMMISSIONER ROBERT GORSKI

Economic Development Coordinator Tony Fradin introduced the commissioners to newly appointed Commissioner Robert Gorski.

Commissioner Gorski introduced himself, stating that he has lived in Bartlett since 1991, raising 3 children. He stated that he has always leaned towards public service, having spent his career as a non-profit CFO, and this new role is an extension of his desire to serve.

Commissioners Kubaszko, Perri and Gudenkauf welcomed Commissioner Gorski.

6. REBECCA'S CAKES BY DESIGN BEDA APPLICATION

Mr. Fradin stated that attracting a bakery to town has been one of the targeted businesses for over ten years.

Since Sorella's Bakery closed in the Devon-Prospect Plaza in 2009, bakery items have primarily been available for sale only at Jewel and through home-based businesses. One such home-based business has been Rebecca's Cakes by Design, owned and operated by Rebecca Lesmeister. Of late, her business has continued to grow to the point where she is ready to move from a home-based business to a small storefront in downtown Bartlett.

Located on the south portion of Main Street Plaza (Krueger portion) in a rear-facing unit, Ms. Lesmeister is building out a small vacant space into the village's first bakery in several years. Mr. Krueger has provided a letter authorizing Ms. Lesmeister to move forward with this application as staff requested.

Mr. Fradin added that having started the process with staff prior to the Village Board's recent updates to the BEDA program, Ms. Lesmeister has submitted the attached application, which includes a detailed business plan along with quotes totaling \$25,000 in improvements. The architect fees add another \$2,000 to the project.

Her business plan details her expertise in baking as well as her vast experience in the field. Ms. Lesmeister is taking her passion for baking to serve a community need by providing baked goods that are not only delicious and safe but a work of art.



She is well-aware of the demand for allergy-friendly baked goods and will fill this need by ensuring safety in all ingredients and consulting with food experts to ensure integrity in their offerings. Ms. Lesmeister accurately points out that there are currently no bakeries in the village as well as limited nut-free offerings in the surrounding area. As customers support independent locally-owned businesses with community ties more often, her timing is good in terms of filling this niche in the village.

Between improving the electrical and plumbing for the unit, Ms. Lesmeister details \$5,500 in build-out costs through John C. Lesmeister Contractors as well as nearly \$3,500 in signage from Bartlett-based Mark Your Space. Ms. Lesmeister is aware of the additional challenges associated with being located in a rear-facing unit, thus her plan includes signage above the front-facing door as depicted in her application.

Her BEDA application shows an anticipated cost of \$27,000 to bring this unit up to current Code and including equipment and signage. The estimates that she turned in amount to \$25,000 but do not include architectural drawings, which is an additional requirement for this project.

Ms. Lesmeister has shared her desire to continue growing this business and eventually move into a larger space, thus she plans to continue making use of this equipment at this and possibly a future location for years to come.

Currently, her business is a one-woman operation, but she plans on hiring someone to assist within six months and a second full-time equivalent within a year.

Mr. Fradin added that as previously stated, attracting a bakery to the downtown area has long been a goal of the village's economic development team.

In keeping with the "shop local" movement and encouraging entrepreneurial residents like Ms. Lesmeister to take the major step from being a home-based business trying to fulfill hundreds of orders to establishing a commercial location, staff is strongly supportive of this endeavor. Staff does not include architectural costs as eligible for reimbursement in the BEDA program, thus are considering this a project with a value of \$25,000.

Mr. Fradin concluded stating that staff proposes a BEDA grant in the amount of \$7,000, which amounts to 28% of the total costs involved to convert this vacant office space into a sales tax-generating business that will nicely fill a need in the village.

Mr. Fradin turned the floor over to the petitioner to introduce herself.

Ms. Lesmeister introduced herself and her husband John, streaming from the inside of the new bakery space. She stated that they have been working on this goal for about a year, but it really became a reality in July when she went full time at home. She added



that she has been making cakes since she was 15 and added that she has 2 kids, one with a nut allergy. Learning the severity of nut allergies in others, she realized the importance of having a nut-free bakery in the area, as there are none nearby. She expressed enthusiasm about her new endeavor, adding that the BEDA grant will really help start them off on the right foot.

Commissioner Perri welcomed Ms. Lesmeister as a new businesswoman to Bartlett. He stated that a town should grow from within expressing great enthusiasm of a resident bringing a new business to town. He concluded by wishing them great success, and to get open as soon as possible.

Commissioner Gudenkauf welcomed Ms. Lesmeister, saying she's excited to be right across the street from a new chamber member.

Mr. Lesmeister stated that they have an inspection tomorrow, and if they pass, they will be hanging drywall this weekend. He added that they are looking to open in January.

Commissioner Kubaszko asked if the petitioners were comfortable with their location in terms of visibility, and people knowing they are there.

Ms. Lesmeister stated that they currently operate out of her home, and with their current clients, they will be able to overcome some of the hurdles in the new location. She stated that this is a stepping stone to a potentially better storefront in the future, but is currently doing what they can.

Commissioner Lewensky added that looking at the business plan, he stated that there is a thorough plan to start advertising and gaining visibility. He also added that he noticed they are the only business in the strip-center registered with Google.

Ms. Lesmeister shared some of the promotions they will be doing early, including a birthday cupcake promotion, discounts for military and service members, etc.

Assistant Village Administrator Scott Skrycki added that the village will be using their resources to promote them as well.

Commissioner Gudenkauf stated that the chamber would do the same.

Commissioner Perri asked what the staples of the bakery would be in terms of items that are made fresh daily.

Ms. Lesmeister stated that there will be cupcakes, cookies, chocolate covered pretzels, muffins, other breakfast pastries and coffee.



Commissioner Lewensky moved to recommend a BEDA Grant in the amount of \$7,000 to Rebecca's Cakes by Design to the Village Board that motion was seconded by Commissioner Perri.

7. SHOP BARTLETT PROMOTION

Management Analyst Joey Dienberg shared the ad with the commissioners, stating that the ad will run in the Examiner through Christmas Day. He added that this promotion in a way is an extension of the Taste of the Towns. He stated that the ad is to encourage residents to shop local this holiday season, not only in terms of retail, but purchasing gift cards to restaurants and service industry businesses as well. He stated that staff will do a drawing in the new year from those who participate and will give out five \$100 gift cards to the winners.

8. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Fradin stated that staff is working with a few businesses on future BEDA Grants. He also added that staff is working on a social media campaign for New Year's as well.

Commissioner Kubaszko asked how the bowling alley in the Streets of Bartlett Is coming along, and also about O'Hare's Pub.

Mr. Fradin stated that early preliminary work is done and the project is moving forward. He stated that Mr. Rafidia is one to work quickly to get projects done, and that it will be here before you know it. He added that O'Hare's has agreed to relocate to provide food and drink to the bowling alley.

Mr. Skrycki added that it will be excited for them to work with Mr. Rafidia and the bowling alley. He expressed optimism in the move and their future success. Scott also pointed out how the Streets of Bartlett went from being one of the most dilapidated centers to soon being 100% occupied in a short amount of time, and one of the liveliest centers on top of that. He also pointed out the new micro-wedding facility, stating that the buildout is very nice, and it is a timely business in terms of people having smaller gatherings. He added that staff will link them with the bakery to help both businesses.



Commissioner Gudenkauf stated that she went in recently and complimented the buildout.

Commissioner Perri asked about the development at Lake Street and Route 59.

Mr. Fradin stated that the project is ongoing, and an extension was recently brought to the Village Board. He added that staff speaks with the developer weekly. Mr. Fradin briefly described the project for the benefit of new Commissioner Gorski.

There being no further business to discuss, Commissioner Gudenkauf moved to adjourn the EDC meeting and that motion was seconded by Commissioner Perri.

BACKGROUND: O'Hare's Pub has been operational in the village for over seven years, first opening at the former Sheep & Fiddle location in the Bartlett Square shopping plaza on Army Trail Road in late 2013.

As their business grew, husband and wife Bill and Peggy O'Hare Vance expanded into Bartlett Town Center, where they have operated since late 2016.

Since coming to town, Peggy and Bill have been active and supportive members of the Bartlett community in supporting local events like the Fourth of July, Heritage Days, parades and races and are also involved with local groups including the Bartlett Women's Club, Chamber of Commerce and more.

This expansion and relocation, in conjunction with the new bowling alley, will bring the former Bartlett Plaza into near full occupancy after being approximately fifty percent vacant as recently as two years ago prior to its purchase, rehabilitation and rebranding by Mr. Rafidia.

In addition to the significant investment and rejuvenation of the center, Ms. Vance estimates needing eight additional full-time staff and additional part-time staff based on events.

BEDA APPLICATION:

This being the first application under the updated version, Ms. Vance has provided a high level of detail about their business's history including sales numbers, as well as a spreadsheet detailing all expenditures to complete this project.

She has cited the total anticipate project cost at \$276,492 per an updated spreadsheet submitted after the initial application.

Since the village has never included or added architectural costs as eligible BEDA costs, we are considering that number to be reduced by \$6,300, thus the physical improvements amount to an investment of approximately \$270,000.

This number constitutes a full build-out from top to bottom including excavation, flooring, electric, fire suppression, plumbing, framing, a cooler system, a hood, cables, kitchen equipment, painting, a new bar top and more.

RECOMMENDATION:

This project helps complete the renovation and reoccupation of the former Bartlett Fresh Market space in the former Bartlett Plaza. Prior to its renovation, the space had been vacant for over eight years.

It will also help retain a key business in the downtown area and village as a whole by incentivizing O'Hare's to expand within the village. Coupled with a new, state-of-the-art bowling alley, the combination of these two businesses is sure to draw both village residents and those in neighboring communities to the area.


Mr. Rafidia was previously approved for and received two BEDA grants of \$50,000 each, the first one being approved in October of 2018 and the second in September of 2019.

Also, keep in mind that the shopping center is comprised of two separate buildings, each with its own Parcel Identification Number.

With the recent modification allowing a two-year timeframe rather than three, and considering the large investment that Peggy O'Hare Vance and Bill Vance are making in the community, we recommend a maximum BEDA grant in the amount of \$50,000, to be paid upon proof of all payments having been made, all improvements having been made to the most current Codes, and final approvals on all inspections.

A grant in that amount would be 18.5% of total project costs.

Moreover, as a condition of approval, I understand the Village may require changes to the scope of work I am proposing. I further understand that any work started or completed prior to approval of the project and my participation in the BEDA program is not eligible for reimbursement.

In making this application, I understand that the BEDA program is competitive, funds are limited and selection for participation is at the sole discretion of the Village of Bartlett. I understand that the Village will review my application and at the Village's discretion may reject or approve my participation in the program. I recognize that a project that enhances the Village's business climate by returning an underutilized property into economic productivity, increases local employment opportunities and includes a larger percentage of private investment than public stands a greater chance of being funded by the Village.

I also understand that if selected for this program, the Village will establish a maximum grant award for the project

I further acknowledge that BEDA operates as a rebate program and, therefore, if selected for participation, Village funds will be disbursed to me at the conclusion of the work, after submittals by me of copies of all bills and satisfactory evidence of their payment, either by lien waivers or bills stamped "Paid" by all contractors. I understand that the actual rebate amount will be calculated at some percentage as recommended by staff in relation to the documented actual costs by me for eligible expenses to complete the agreed upon improvements, up to the maximum grant amount awarded by the Village for the project.

A New Year begins and a New O'Hare's Pub & Restaurant begins! We welcome 2021.

O'Hare's Pub & Restaurant wishes to be considered for Economic Development Assistance through the Village of Bartlett BEDA Grant Program.

This is the third location for O'Hare's Pub & Restaurant in Bartlett. Our first location was when we first moved here in 2013 to be near our son and his family and twin boys. The job market was difficult since we were from Michigan so we decided to invest our future in Bartlett. In November of 2013, we took over Sheep & Fiddle at 1085 West Army Trail Road. At that location, we did well and better than any other business there but we were a <u>destination</u>. Due to an agreement by the landlord and Blackhawk Gaming Company were only allowed 3 video gaming machines. We felt our potential to grow was limited at this location. When the lease was up for renewal in 2016, we decided to take a leap of faith and move to Bartlett Town Center so we had more opportunities to grow our business.

We were not wrong! Our second location opened at 207 S. Main Street at the end of 2016 and O'Hare's quadrupled in sales within a year in the new downtown location taking us to just shy of 1MM in restaurant sales. We were able to accommodate over 80 people when we were full. We were able to bring a bit of Irish and weeklong St. Patrick's celebrations to downtown Bartlett. Many people from outside Bartlett came to O'Hare's for our celebrations.

Additionally, we were able to be much more involved in the community in supporting Fourth of July events, Bartlett Heritage Days, the Halloween Parade, the Lions Club Run, and the Bike Race. Since I am involved with Bartlett Women's Club, VFW Auxiliary, and the Bartlett Area Chamber, we were able to host quite a few events.

The downtown location provided the opportunity for 5 video gaming machines at first and then we increased to 6 machines gaming a monthly income of approximately \$5M. An example of the money played it is on Illinois Gaming Board website. O'Hare's had activity from Jan 2020 – Nov 2020 of \$1,678,219.00 was "played" in its video gaming machines even during a pandemic year.

Although our location has been tremendous, we have another opportunity to move to Bartlett Plaza under the management of Manny and Jeremy Rafidia. The new location, which is part of the grocery store space, we believe will help us grow again by nature of location, capacity for guest's increases by 24 inside and 24 outside, and family activity of an adjoining bowling alley that we will also manage. There is opportunity to create outdoor events with the other businesses as well, helping everyone in Bartlett Plaza to grow business.

With the new location, we have no hesitation in stating our sales will grow to \$3MM per year because O'Hare's Pub & Restaurant will be the food and beverage sole supplier for the bowling alley and all the activities of the bowling alley such as the leagues, events, and parties. O'Hare's will have seating capacity indoor and outdoor for 120 guests.

Additional revenue will come from having 6 new-upgraded video gaming machines in a new special designed area that will be separated from the dining area and from anywhere young people will be.

Pre-Covid-19 we expected to have video gaming income of \$6M per month. In the new location, we expect to double that amount.

As excited as we are for the new location, it has been another leap of faith in managing the costs involved especially during a pandemic. In our heart's we know this is as good a time as any since we are closed at 207 S Main Street. With only carryout food orders to support the restaurant it was a challenge meeting our monthly bills. Therefore, we made an agreement with the landlord to vacate and we brought in a new breakfast diner to take over the space allowing us to take this opportunity for O'Hare's at Bartlett Plaza.

Attached you will find a spreadsheet with our expenses to date and the expenses yet to be taken to bring our investment to approximately \$260,393.72, estimated grand total to Open 391 Bartlett Plaza.

We are waiting for a third quote for flooring in an attempt to reduce the \$40,000 price tag on flooring. We are also waiting for a quote on painting and removing our old sign and putting it up at Bartlett Plaza.

The spreadsheet illustrates the expenses and we have mentioned the increase in sales. What is important to the community are jobs too. Our location is walkable and it is close to the train station for future employees. We expect to have 30 employees if not more. Our opportunity to be open at 11 am daily allows for 2 full shifts. Daytime shift will be approximately 8-10 staff and our nighttime shift will be 12–20 staff depending on staff needed for the bowling alley and parties.

We should add that the bowling alley is expected to garner \$600M in sales its first year just from bowling. There will also be arcade games, pool tables, and air hockey tables.



- 391 Bartlett Plaza
 - o Between Magnolia Weddings & Events Venue and Midway Lanes Bowling Alley.
- Magnolia Weddings does not have a kitchen and we will work with them closely for opportunities to cater to them as well as the other restaurants in Bartlett.
- Midway Lanes does not have a kitchen and we will supply all food and drink to the bowling alley.
- O'Hare's sales are expected to be \$3M within 3 years.
- It is expected that we will need 8 full time staff and will continue to use part time staff of approximately 15-20. It will vary based on events.
 - o O'Hare's employs 3 full time staff and 17 part time staff currently.
- O'Hare's new location will allow for 100 indoor seating and 24 outdoor seating compared to 81 with 12 seats on the patio.
- We will continue to support Bartlett and working with Magnolia Wedding & Events, Lisa's School
 of Dance and other businesses in the Plaza to bring outdoor events to Bartlett Plaza. Of course,
 with necessary permissions.

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT MEMORANDUM**

DATE: January 7, 2021

TO: Chairman and Members of the Economic Development Commission

FROM: Tony Fradin, Economic Development Coordinator 7

**RE:** Branding Discussion

### **BACKGROUND:**

Municipal branding is an important aspect of successfully marketing a community.

With many towns throughout the northwest suburbs, the state and the entire country competing for businesses that are able to select where they prefer to be located and often request incentives from multiple potential locations, differentiating your town from the others is both more challenging and more important than ever.

As we make our way out of the pandemic, during which a fair number of projects including the new Culver's, multiple new restaurants, fuel stations and industrial projects have moved forward, the village is once again looking to position itself for future growth through the rest of the Twenties and beyond, thus we are looking at ways to rebrand the village.

The last time that the EDC and village looked to rebrand itself, we moved away from the "Bartlett Pear" concept to the "Never Far Away" tagline and logo depicting various building structures, a Bartlett "skyline" image.

After a series of brainstorming sessions with the EDC at which numerous slogans and accompanying images were provided, the aforementioned tagline and logo was recommended.

At the time, many businesses and investors would claim Bartlett to be "too far out" beyond the range of dense suburbs where they considered expanding into.

As development has expanded and this issue has declined over the years, and the village has been better able to distinguish itself from the surrounding suburbs, we now embark to incorporate a new branding strategy.

### **MUNICIPAL BRANDING:**

In our area, various municipalities are well-known for various strengths.

Wheeling is well-known for its restaurant row. Elk Grove Village is best known for having the largest industrial park in the U.S. and began using the tagline "Makers Wanted" several years ago. Schaumburg is best known for its vast retail offerings and the Tri-Cities along the Fox River, Geneva, Batavia, and St. Charles, are well-known for their charming downtown areas.

Municipal branding as a whole is comprised of many facets, chief among them that

- (1) It helps differentiate a community from others.
- (2) A new logo and tagline do not, in itself, constitute a new strategy. Tactics should represent an integrated, multi-platform approach. Remember, the more times people hear and see your brand and the more ways in which they are exposed to it, the more likely they are to remember it, talk about it, and act as a result of it.
- (3) What others say about you not what you say about yourself will build your brand. In today's world of highly-competitive marketing, advertisements, printed materials, direct mail packages, DVDs, and website are becoming less and less effective. They are part of "the clutter" an estimated 3,000+ marketing messages that the average consumer is hit with every day. Only a very small number of marketing messages actually get through and the ones that do are the ones that come from highly credible sources;
- (4) It needs to strike the right balance between external customer and the internal ones. In a perfect world, we could focus entirely on external customers like corporate site selectors and brokers who influence these investment decisions, knowledge and other skilled workers we are seeking to attract to the village and the news media who are credible, third-party influencers of all of the above groups.

However, these days with the proliferation of local social media, blogs, and similar sites, an effective brand provides an opportunity for innovative communities to build a similar group of "electronic ambassadors."

(5) It needs Buy-In. Brands almost always fail to gain traction when those at the top don't seek input or involvement from stakeholders.

Think about the great pride Bartletters feel for their home community. Some may not appreciate how their hometown will be represented to the outside world.

Thus, involving stakeholders helps make those who feel they were part of the process much more likely to embrace the brand and its purpose.

### **STAFF REQUEST:**

Since this branding campaign may take some time, staff requests that each member of the EDC think about what positive attributes differentiate the Village of Bartlett from the many others in our area and in the Chicago area at large.

Some obvious ones include the high level of safety, the family-oriented nature of the community, the active sports and recreational communities, as well as our growing food niche, both in terms of industrial businesses and those open to the public. We have additionally seen a greater number of entrepreneurial residents open small businesses over the past few years.

We request that each commissioner provide some suggestions about which attribute(s) of the village should be focused on at a future meeting as part of this important rebranding process, which we will continue in the coming months.
