

Bartlett Pups & Some "Tastefully" Created Art

PUP Art, pop art inspired paintings by 30 Bartlett dogs, is currently on display at Bartlett Village Hall. Pop Art began as an art movement in the United States in the early 1950s and peaked in the 1960s with artists like Andy Warhol, whose work is being celebrated this summer at The Cleve Carney Museum of Art and the McAninch Arts Center at College of DuPage.



Bartlett's artistic dogs created their version of pop or PUP art in conjunction with

Bartlett's DuPage Warhol Pop Art Challenge, also on exhibit at the hall. From 6-monthold chihuahua Violet to 13-year-old mixed breed Payton, and 28 dogs in between, each canine's unique colorful creation was aided by peanut butter on the outside of a plastic bag that contained the paint and canvas. Police Accreditation Assessment Invites Public Comment

An assessor from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA) will arrive on 7/24 to examine all aspects of Bartlett Police Department's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. Verification by the assessor that Bartlett Police Department meets the commission's state-of-the-art standards is part of a voluntary process to gain accreditation – a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence. Bartlett Police Department has to comply with 461 standards in order to gain accreditation status.

The police department received initial accreditation in 1997, becoming the first department in the Tri-Village area to achieve this status in the law enforcement community. In 2000, 2003, 2006, 2009, 2012, 2015 and 2019 the Bartlett Police Department underwent the re-accreditation process, which demonstrates a continual commitment to the process. The CALEA assessment process now includes a re-assessment every four years, along with annual web-based reviews.

As part of the site-based assessment, police department employees and members of the community are invited to offer comments via an online public portal. The online CALEA comment portal has replaced the public hearing and phone-in session of the reaccreditation process. Accreditation webpage if you would like to participate in the public comment portion, to provide comments, commendations, or other information regarding the Bartlett Police Department's quality of service or other information relevant to the re-accreditation process.

Comments made to the online public portal must address Bartlett Police Department's ability to comply with CALEA's standards. A copy of the standards is available for viewing at the Bartlett Police Department.

ComEd Tree Trimming

You may see arborists performing vegetation management for ComEd in your neighborhood, now through September.

Trees and branches that interfere with power lines can create safety hazards and cause power outages. Preventative tree maintenance helps avoid power outages.

ComEd crews will trim trees, branches and vines that interfere or have the potential to interfere with power lines. In some cases, tree removal may be required. The remaining tree stumps are treated with an approved herbicide to prevent future regrowth. Herbicide will be applied by state-licensed applicators, and all work is performed by trained, qualified arborists.
