Semi-Annual Brush Collection - No Bundling

The Village of Bartlett contracts with Trees "R" Us to provide semi-annual brush pickup in the spring and fall that does NOT require bundling.

Place all non-bundled brush in the parkway, cut ends facing street, by 7 a.m. on the Monday morning of your area's assigned week. The pickup for your specific block may not occur until later in the week depending on how many households in each area are using this service. However, once the truck goes down a street they will NOT go back around a second time. Please DO NOT put brush piles under trees, next to fixtures, mailboxes or power poles, etc.

Dates for the Fall 2023 Semi-Annual Brush Collection:

Week of 10/2: homes west of S. Bartlett and south of the Metra tracks Week of 10/9: ALL homes east of S. Bartlett plus ALL homes north of the Metra tracks.

Bartlett Police Department and other local police departments have experienced an increase in burglary to motor vehicles and stolen vehicles during the late evening or early morning hours, specifically targeting unlocked vehicles with the keys or key fobs left inside.

Most recently, Bartlett Police investigated reports of burglary to motor vehicles or attempted burglary to motor vehicles on Oakmont, Amherst, Longford, and Adare and a stolen vehicle on Harvard Court, where the homeowner left the car unlocked with the keys left inside the vehicle. These stolen vehicles and their license plates are often used to commit other serious types of crimes.

Please be vigilant in securing your vehicle by making sure your doors are locked and your windows are completely rolled up. Remove all valuable items, including wallets, purses, and electronic devices from your vehicle. Also, make sure your key or key fob is not left or hidden inside your vehicle.

Bartlett police officers are continuing to conduct extra neighborhood patrols and work with other local police departments to investigate the recent occurrences of stolen vehicles and burglaries to motor vehicles. You are encouraged not to approach any burglary suspects, but rather to immediately call 9-1-1 to report any suspicious activities in your

Septembr is Suicide Prevention Month

DuPage County—Every year, during National Suicide Prevention Month, individuals and organizations come together to highlight the problem of suicide and advocate its prevention.

Suicide is a serious public health problem that continues to be a persistent threat to area community members and their families. DuPage County has averaged 94 deaths per year to suicide during the past five years according to data from the DuPage County Coroner.

While suicide prevention is multilayered, knowing the warning signs and supportive services available is one way everyone can contribute to preventing suicide deaths.

Suicide Warning Signs

- Talking about or making plans for suicide
- Displaying severe/overwhelming emotional pain or distress
- Showing worrisome changes in behavior, including withdrawing from social connections, sleeping too little or too much, displaying anger or hostility that seems out of character
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly
- Talking about being a burden to others
- Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain
- Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs
- Talking about feeling hopeless about the future or having no reason to live
- Displaying extreme mood swings

Devon Excess Flow Plant Rehabilitation

This project consists of a new lift station and force main to allow all excess Cook County flow to travel to the Bittersweet WRF. This will allow the village to eliminate the Devon excess flow facility and comply with IEPA regulations.

As part of this major project, the contractor recently installed 16-inch PVC force main down Amherst Drive, heading east towards Prospect. Here is a drone shot of the work.
