Bartlett PD Awarded Traffic Enforcement Grant

The Bartlett Police Department has been awarded a federal fiscal year 2024 Sustained Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) grant to conduct



additional traffic safety enforcement. STEP focuses on high visibility enforcement on specific times and dates of the year. The enforcement efforts are designed to save lives and prevent injuries by reducing traffic crashes.

"We're pleased to receive this grant to step up our road safety efforts with the goal of saving lives," said Deputy Chief Rob Sweeney. "Our mission is to make travel safer through directed, proactive patrols and to stop, cite and arrest those who choose to violate traffic laws."

During the STEP grant year, which runs from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2024, the police department supplement mandatory and optional campaign enforcement dates scheduled during some of the deadliest times of the year.

The additional efforts will focus on the leading contributers to crashes -- speeding, impaired driving, electronic device use, failure to yield and disobeying traffic control signals -- as well as occupant restraint violations.

The STEP grant is funded by federal highway safety funds administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

Paperless Water Bills

The village offers you the option to help protect the environment by choosing to receive your utility bill via email.

Simply fill out the form on the village website to sign up for paperless water-sewer bills. You will need your account number and your customer number, found on your existing water-sewer bill, to sign up.

Please note, if you sign up after the 15th of the month you will not begin receiving your e-bill until the 2nd billing cycle. For example, if you sign up on April 3, you will receive your first e-bill in May. If you sign up on April 16, you will not receive your first e-bill until June.

PROJECTS

Devon Lift Station & Force Main Project Update

10/16-10/20: Contractor PCE returned to the jobsite 10/18, installed and repaired large diameter storm sewers and installed 100 linear feet of force main from Prospect down to Country.

10/23-10/27: PCE installed 6 air release valves and 110 feet of force main along Country.

10/30-11/10: Temporary patching, restoration and cleanup along existing route.

11/13-11/17: PCE installed 3 air release valves and 1,158 linear feet of force main. Contractor Martam broke ground and excavated for the lift station.

11/20-11/24: Martam installed the shoring and large excavation areas. PCE installed air release valves and performed cleanup and temporary patching for the Thanksgiving holiday.
