# Stop. Look. Lock - Prevent Hot Car Deaths



During the past 25 years, more than 970 children have died of heatstroke, because they were left or became trapped in a hot car. It's important for everyone to understand these tragedies can happen to anyone – but are always preventable.

#### **Parents and Caregivers**

1. Never leave a child in a vehicle unattended for any length of time. Rolling windows down or parking in the shade does little to change the interior temperature of the vehicle.

2. Make it a habit to check your entire vehicle — especially the back seat — before locking the doors and walking away.

3. Ask your childcare provider to call if your child doesn't show up for care as expected.

4. Place a personal item like a purse or briefcase in the back seat, as another reminder to look before you lock. Write a note or place a stuffed animal in the passenger's seat to remind you that a child is in the back seat.

5. Store car keys out of a child's reach and teach children that a vehicle is not a play

area.

#### Secure Your Car

Always lock your car when you aren't using it. Even if you don't have a child of your own, a child in your neighborhood could get into your unlocked vehicle.

#### Act Fast. Save a Life.

If you see a child alone in a locked car, act immediately and call 911. A child in distress due to heat should be removed from the vehicle as quickly as possible and rapidly cooled.

#### Keeping Animals Safe When It's Hot

- Never leave pets in the car! Temperatures rise quickly even with the windows down and can be deadly for your pet.
- Always call 911 if you see a pet or child in a hot car.
- Be sure your pets have access to plenty of water, especially when it's hot.
- Make sure your pet has plenty of shady places to go when outdoors.
- Be cautious when walking your pet. Test sidewalks with your hand. If it's too hot for your hand, it's probably too hot for your pet.
- Avoid exercising with your pet outside on extremely hot days.

# 2023 Annual Water Quality Report

In 2023 the Village of Bartlett water system pumped 1,194,805,000 gallons to its consumers. All of Bartlett's water came from Lake Michigan, pumped here from Chicago through the DuPage Water Commission (DWC) system.

By law the Village of Bartlett must provide information to its residents regarding water quality. Bartlett's annual Water Quality Report, delivered to residential households each summer, meets the federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requirements for "Consumer Confidence Reports" and contains information on the source of Bartlett's water, its constituents and the health risks associated with any contaminants.

Safe water is vital to the community and the village tests and monitors its water quality on a continual basis. National Lightning Safety Awareness Week (June 23 - 29 this year) was started in 2001 to call attention to lightning danger and encourage people to learn more about lightning safety.

# What You Might Not Know About Lightning

- All thunderstorms produce lightning and are dangerous. Fortunately, people can be safe if they follow some simple guidelines when thunderstorms are forecast.
- Lightning often strikes outside the area of heavy rain and may strike as far as 10 miles from any rainfall. Many lightning deaths occur ahead

- of storms before any rain arrives or after storms have seemingly passed and the rain has ended.
- If you can hear thunder, you are in danger. Don't be fooled by blue skies. If you hear thunder, lightning is close enough to pose an immediate threat.
- Lightning leaves many victims with permanent disabilities. While only about 10% of lightning victims die, many survivors must live the rest of their lives with intense pain, neurological disabilities, depression, and other health problems.

#### Avoid the Lightning Threat

- Have a lightning safety plan. Know where you'll go for safety and ensure you'll have enough time to get there.
- Postpone activities. Consider postponing activities if thunderstorms are forecast.
- Monitor the weather. Once outside, look for signs of a developing or approaching thunderstorm such as towering clouds, darkening skies, or flashes of lightning.
- Get to a safe place. If you hear thunder, even a distant rumble, seek safety immediately. Fully enclosed buildings with wiring and plumbing are best. A hard-topped metal vehicle with the windows closed is also safe. Stay inside until 30 minutes after the last rumble of thunder. Sheds, picnic shelters, tents or covered porches do NOT protect you from lightning.
- If you hear thunder, don't use a corded phone except in an emergency. Cordless phones and cell phones are safe to use.
- Keep away from electrical equipment and plumbling. Lightning will travel through the wiring and plumbing if your building is struck. Don't take a bath or shower, or wash dishes during a storm.

b. Flood zone, base elevation and panel reference information from the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) 2. Floodway locations and regulatory requirements for development in a floodway

3. Wetland and open space information and regulations that may prohibit development in these areas.


