DuPage County

In-person Early Voting for the November 5 General Election begins Thursday, September 26, 2024, at the following locations:

- DuPage County Fairgrounds (Building 5): 2015 W Manchester Rd, Wheaton, IL 60187
- Addison Township Office: 401 N Addison Rd, Addison, IL 60101
- Bartlett Community Center: 700 S Bartlett Rd, Bartlett, IL 60103
- Downers Grove Recreation Center: 4500 Belmont Rd, Downers Grove, IL 60515
- Naperville Municipal Center: 400 S Eagle St, Naperville, IL 60540

These locations will be open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. and Saturdays 9 a.m. until noon until October 19, 2024. These and additional locations will open for early voting as Permanent Locations, with extended hours, starting Monday, October 21, 2024.

Cook County

There are three ways to cast a ballot in suburban Cook County for the 2024 Presidential Elections. Eligible voters can participate in Early Voting, Vote By Mail or on Election Day at their assigned polling place.

For the November 5, 2024 Presidential Election, traditional Early Voting will take place October 21 through November 4 at multiple suburban Cook County locations, including: STREAMWOOD VILLAGE HALL, REAR GARAGE, 351 E. Irving Park Road, Streamwood, IL 60103.

October 21 through November 4, 2024 Monday to Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sunday (Oct. 27 & Nov 3) 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Beginning October 9, limited Early Voting will be available Monday through Friday from

9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at all five suburban Cook County Circuit Courthouse locations and in downtown Chicago at 69 W. Washington.

Order Your Parkway Tree by 9/27



This beautiful Blackgum tree is just one of several species available in this fall's Parkway Tree Replacement Program. For many years, the Village of Bartlett has planted trees with the help of homeowners in an effort to reforest and diversify Bartlett's parkways. This program provides the opportunity for residents to select and purchase a parkway tree, with the Village sharing 50 percent of the cost.

The cost for residents is \$100 per tree. This price includes tree planting, a one-time mulching, and a one-year warranty. Limited quantities of each species are available, and all orders are filled on a first-come, first served basis. All orders and payments must be received by September 27.

The Hanover Township shuttle runs continuously from the Jim Jensen Pavilion to Leiseberg Park starting at 5 p.m., with the last return trip at 10:45 p.m. on both Friday and Saturday.

September is National Suicide Prevention Month

Every year, the 988 Lifeline and other mental health organizations and individuals across the U.S. raise awareness of suicide prevention during September, National Suicide Prevention Month. We can all help prevent suicide.

#BeThe1To is the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline's message for National Suicide Prevention Month and beyond, which helps spread the word about actions we can all take to prevent suicide. The Lifeline network and its partners are working to change the conversation from suicide to suicide prevention, to actions that can promote healing, help and give hope.

#BeThe1To:

ASK - Research shows people who are having thoughts of suicide feel relief when someone asks after them in a caring way. Findings suggest acknowledging and talking about suicide may reduce rather than increase suicidal ideation.

BE THERE - Individuals are more likely to feel less depressed, less suicidal, less overwhelmed, and more hopeful after speaking to someone who listens without judgment.

KEEP THEM SAFE - A number of studies have indicated that when lethal means are made less available or less deadly, suicide rates by that method decline, and frequently suicide rates overall decline.

HELP THEM STAY CONNECTED -Studies indicate that helping someone at risk create a network of resources and individuals for support and safety can help them take positive action and reduce feelings of hopelessness.

FOLLOW UP - Studies have also shown that brief, low cost intervention and supportive, ongoing contact may be an important part of suicide prevention, especially for individuals after they have been discharged from hospitals or care services.
