RE: Impact Fee Comparison

As directed by the Committee of the Whole, planning staff contacted 14 surrounding communities to compare their impact fees collected during the building permit process. Bartlett is the only community that includes the impact fee/donation chart within their municipal code.

Impact fees/developer donations are typically determined using the fair market value (FMV) of land and the potential impact of the new population generated by the proposed development. While many communities set the (FMK), others require the developer to submit an appraisal. For those communities that require an appraisal, they did not provide estimates for the impact fees as they are each determined on an individual basis. These communities include Bloomingdale, Hanover Park and Hoffman Estates.

Staff compared the impact fees collected for a 4-bedroom home and a 2bedroom apartment for the communities that we contacted.

The communities below could not provide the full impact fee amounts because the school and library impact fees are determined on an individual basis.

The amended ordinances have been effective in reducing the number of repeated calls for service at the same location. Many of the complainants understand and appreciate that the police officers can issue a citation for violations but can also use discretion in determining the best course of action depending on the circumstances of the situation.

RE:	Noise Ordinance Review

In July 2024, the Village board approved amendments to three sections of the Village Code that pertained to noise limitations. Section 4-3-4 "Excessive Noise," Section 3-22-2 "Amplifier Regulations," and Section 1-15-4 "Complaints and Notices of Hearing Procedures."

The amendments to Section 4-3-4 added residential to the areas the excessive noise ordinance would apply. The amendments to Section 3-22-2 modified the time and distance requirements for the operation of an amplifier within the Village and added a penalty section in which a fine of not less than seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) could be imposed on violators for each offense. The amendments to Section 1-15-4 added Section 4-3-4 and Section 3-22-2 to the list of offenses which allow first time violators the option of avoiding an in-person appearance at an administrative hearing by paying a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) within ten (10) days after service of the violation notice.

Since July, the police department has responded to 123 noise complaints. Of those complaints, 63 were loud music complaints, 37 were loud party/people complaints, and 23 were loud vehicle/other complaints. 54 complaints occurred between the hours of 11:00 pm-8:00 am and 69 complaints occurred between the hours of 8:00 am-11:00 pm. To date, the following outcomes have occurred: 64 times the noise was abated, 59 times officers were unable to locate/no noise violation occurred, 0 citations were issued.

Officers have seen an improvement in the number of complaints received at Deere Park Circle, 19 complaints, and very few repeated calls for service for the same offenders.

In October 2024, the police department received multiple complaints regarding noise coming from a business located in a mixed-use residential building. It was determined that the business was operating in violation of the Village's Zoning Ordinance, and they were informed they would need to receive a special use permit from the Village to continue to play live music from the establishment. It was also determined that both Section 4-3-4 "Excessive Noise" and Section 3-22-2 "Amplifier Regulations" would be enforceable by the police department should noise violations continue to occur.

The amended ordinances have been effective in reducing the number of repeated calls for service at the same locations. Many of the complainants understand and appreciate that the police officers can issue a citation for violations but can also use discretion in determining the best course of action depending on the circumstances of the situation.

Subject: Requirement for Special Use Permit for Live Entertainment

Dear Ms. Estrada,

Please allow this correspondence to serve as formal notice that Issa's Restaurant and Bar ("Issa's"), located at 207 Main Street, Bartlett, IL ("Premises"), is in violation of the Bartlett Zoning Ordinance. The Village of Bartlett has become aware that Issa's is hosting live entertainment, including DJ Performances and dancing, on the Premises. You must cease and desist from hosting live entertainment events at the premises until you have the necessary zoning approvals.

According to the Village of Bartlett Zoning Ordinance, any restaurant intending to operate as a tavern with live entertainment, such as music performances, DJ services, or dancing, must obtain a Special Use Permit to conduct such activities. This is necessary to ensure that such activities comply with local zoning laws and community guidelines, which are in place to preserve the safety, welfare, and quality of life for both businesses and residents. As you know, Issa's has not applied for or received a special use permit to operate as a tavern with live entertainment.

In order to host these types of events, you would need to apply for and receive approval for a Special Use Permit. The application process typically includes a public hearing before the Planning and Zoning Commission, final review by the Village Board, and possible conditions on the entertainment activities, such as hours of operation, noise restrictions, soundproofing and occupancy limits. The approval process takes several months. There is no guarantee that the Special Use Permit will be granted, and you must ensure that you satisfy all of the Village's standards for the issuance of a special use permit under the Bartlett Zoning Ordinance.

If you continue to operate live entertainment on the Premises without the necessary zoning approvals, the Village will have to take further enforcement action, including, but not limited to, the issuance of citations

that carry potential fines. Thank you for your attention to this matter. We look forward to working with you to ensure that your business remains in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.
